JR SOS 2026, the largest junior event of the year, has come and gone once again, leaving tons of fun for memory books. This year marked 35 years of this fantastic event with all the fun starting Sunday, July 12th at Ducks with Beginner Shag Class and lots of social dancing. The turnout for the first night was terrific. We had seven juniors representing RHSC in attendance. At the final count, we had 866 in attendance, with 302 of that being juniors.

Monday morning the Registration Room was hopping as kids signed in and headed over to the Ballroom for Beginner Class taught by their favorite instructors – Jackie McGee and Michael Norris. The room was packed. Everyone worked hard learning and seemed to catch on quickly.



The Afternoon brought in tons of fun starting with the Line Dance Class. We all learned “Footloose” Line Dance, which was a big hit. May have to teach that at our Friday M&G. Then came the Line Dance Challenge. This is always so much fun. Kids were divided into six teams. They are given a song and had 25 minutes to make up a line dance. It amazes me how they come up with some great dances. I am proud to say our very own junior, Hayden Brown’s team, won this year. They performed it for everyone at the Thursday

night event. Then came Shag Showdown competition with 32 kids participating. Carson Fogel and Abigail Hodges took home the win. They competed in the finals of the showdown on Thursday night. Rebecca Hodges & Parker Caldwell were named the champions of the Shag Showdown 2026.



Monday night everyone headed to Fat Harold’s Back Room for the PIZZA PARTY sponsored by Karyn Allen, Tiffany Allen, & Zoey Cathcart. After everyone finished up the pizza, they added a new event this year – “So You Think You Can Sing” (otherwise known as KARAOKE). There were so many kids that signed up to sing. WALL OF FAME

The purpose of the Wall of Fame Award is to recognize RHSC members who have made outstanding contributions within the club and/or shag community. The primary focus is on outstanding contributions of time, talent, and effort to and for our club. A nominee must be nominated by a current, active member of the club by nomination form to be considered by the selection committee. Nominees are listed once on the ballot regardless of the number of recommendations received. The nominee may be living or deceased. There will be a maximum of (2) qualified nominees voted in each year.

Nominations will be accepted from August 1 – October 1 (firm deadline).

Below are the guidelines to help you make your nomination. All nominees are graded on a Point System to determine eligibility. Nomination forms will be emailed to each club member, and all nominations must be submitted on this form in order for them to be considered.

- A. Years in the shag club (must have been an active member for a minimum of 5 years)
- B. Offices held
- C. Committees chaired and/or served on
- D. How the nominee promotes our club
- E. How the nominee regularly and effectively participates in club activities, be specific
- F. The nominee's contribution as a dance instructor, DJ, etc.
- G. Other contributions to the shag club or shag community
- H. Is the nominee a positive role model for our club and for this award? Be persuasive!!
